We are pleased to report that our students have performed strongly with Year 7 and 9 results in Reading, Writing and Numeracy exceeding those of Similar Schools and the State average. In Writing, results were also higher than the average of schools in our Network.

These results reflect the strength of our teaching programs and our commitment to continuous improvement, particularly through the middle years. Our Year 7 cohort shows great potential, and we are focused on extending our capable learners while continuing to support those identified as 'Developing' or 'Needing Additional Support.'

CITY CITE

"It showed me that learning doesn't just happen from books or lessons, it can also come from real-world experiences", Tina from 9A states as she and the rest of her class reflect on their weekexcursion to Melbourne CBD. As part of the City Cite Program, Year 9 students researched a growing issue in our backyard, such as homelessness and safety and crime. Students also got to see a whole new perspective of Melbourne, with students living and breathing the cultural side of the city, from Art that decorated the building walls to hundreds of different food delicacies. As Huzafa says, "Now I know that the city is where there are a bunch of communities with their own stories".

As part of their research, the Year 9 students developed their communication skills by interviewing members of the public and public servants alike, as they delved deeper into understanding the communities around them. It allowed students, like Ngoc Kim, to see Melbourne's different sides as she reflects, "It made me more aware of things I didn't notice before". Through it all, the Year 9 students not only learned something new about Melbourne, but something new about themselves. Naman, for example, learned to "appreciate the things I have and think more about how I can help others". These experiences shape the thinking of our students, and help them to become better citizens of our community.











AUSTRALIAN MATHS COMP



Over 260 students from Years 7 to 12 competed in the Australian Mathematics Competition (ACM) this year. This is up from 198 in 2024. The AMC is Australia's longest running, largest and most well-known maths competition for school students, with tens of thousands of students participating. It contains a wide range of mathematical concepts and unique problems designed to challenge and extend students' problem-solving skills. Students answer 30 questions of increasing complexity over 75 minutes. The aim is to engage, enrich and extend students in Mathematics. All students receive an award ranging from Participation to High Distinction. All participants are to be congratulated for taking on the challenge!
